## How to Set Up a Source - Destination Integration

Exalate needs to be installed as a dedicated app on both Source and Destination. So you need a valid Exalate license at both ends.

**Note:** Exalate supports decentralized integration. This allows you to control the outgoing and incoming information independently within Source and Destination. You can learn more about [this feature](#).
